

Genevieve's on Du Fresne

Within metres of Rocky Bay which is suitable for kayaking, snorkelling and fishing, or watching the dolphins frolicking in the bay. Just 3 minutes walk will take you to a sandy beach safe for the whole family to swim. The historic township of Russell is just 2 km away with plenty of cafes and restaurants that caters for all tastes including the Duke of Marlborough Hotel on the waterfront for fine dining, Thai restaurant, Indian restaurant and many others to suit your tastes and budget. Historical features include the Christ church the first church built in New Zealand, Pompallier Mission and printing works that survived the sacking of the township in 1845 by Hone Heke. Also on the hill is the flagstaff that was chopped down by Hone Heke with a panoramic view of the Bay of Islands.

Activities include a range of cruises in the Bay of Islands including swimming with the Dolphins and Hole in the Rock cruises. There are kayaks also electric bikes for hire Russell is central to many excursions including a trip to Cape Reinga and 90 Mile Beach, visits to Kerikeri and the Stone Store, Waitangi Treaty Grounds where the Treaty of Waitangi was signed, Kauri Forests and many more attractions of the Far North.
